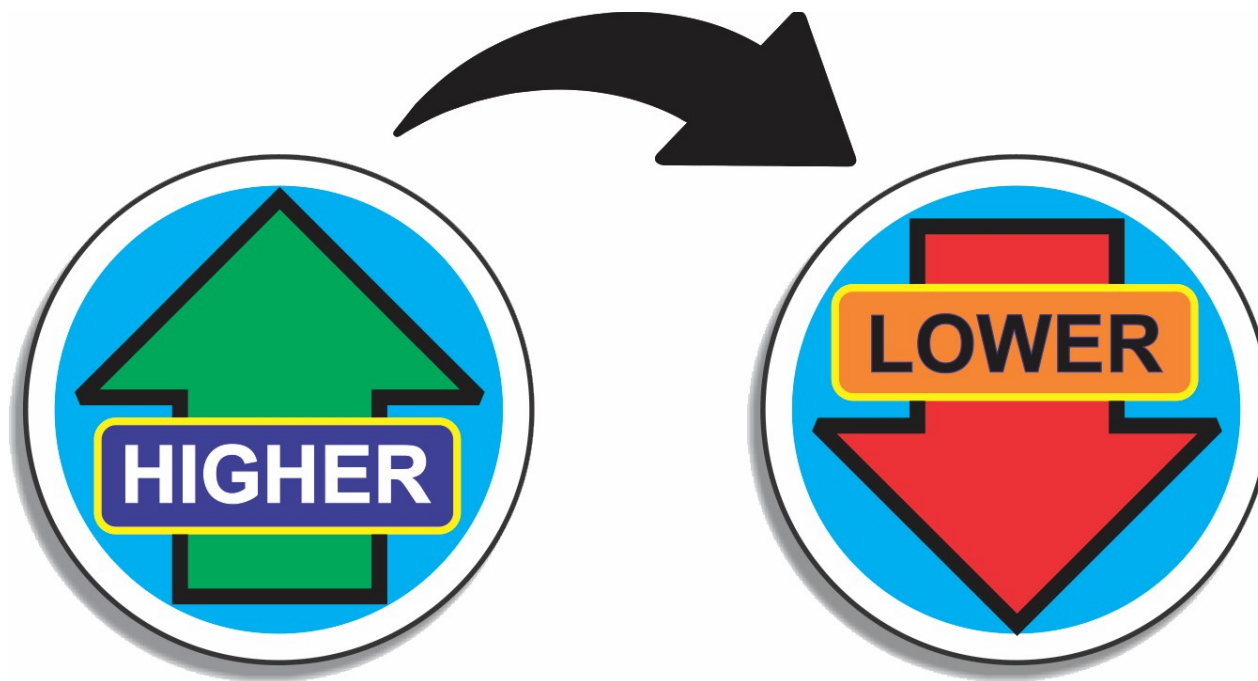

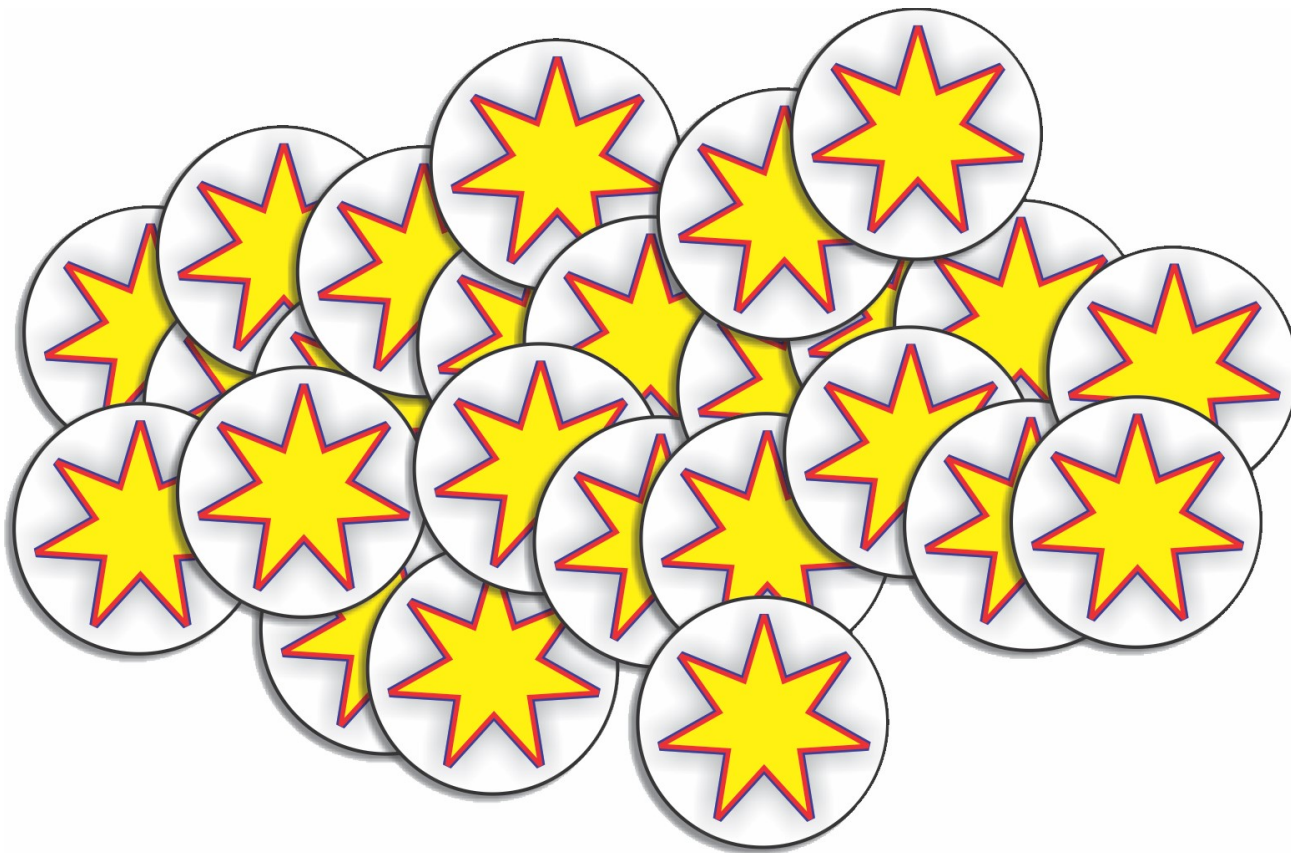
**To start, get your group together.
The game is for up to 6 players.**



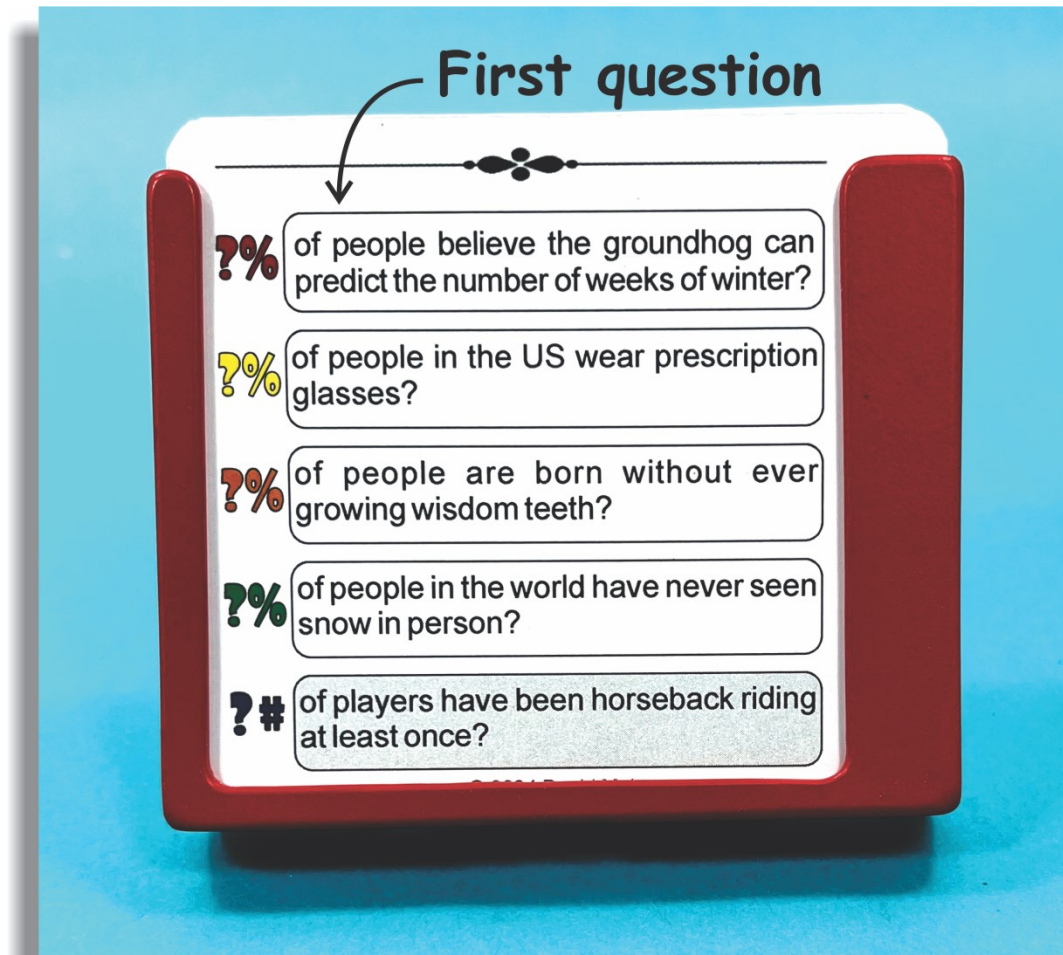
Give each player a double sided "Higher/Lower" disc.



Place the pile of scoring chips within easy reach.



A starting player is chosen and given the card holder. The first question is read aloud to the group. "What % of people believe the groundhog can predict the number of weeks of winter?"



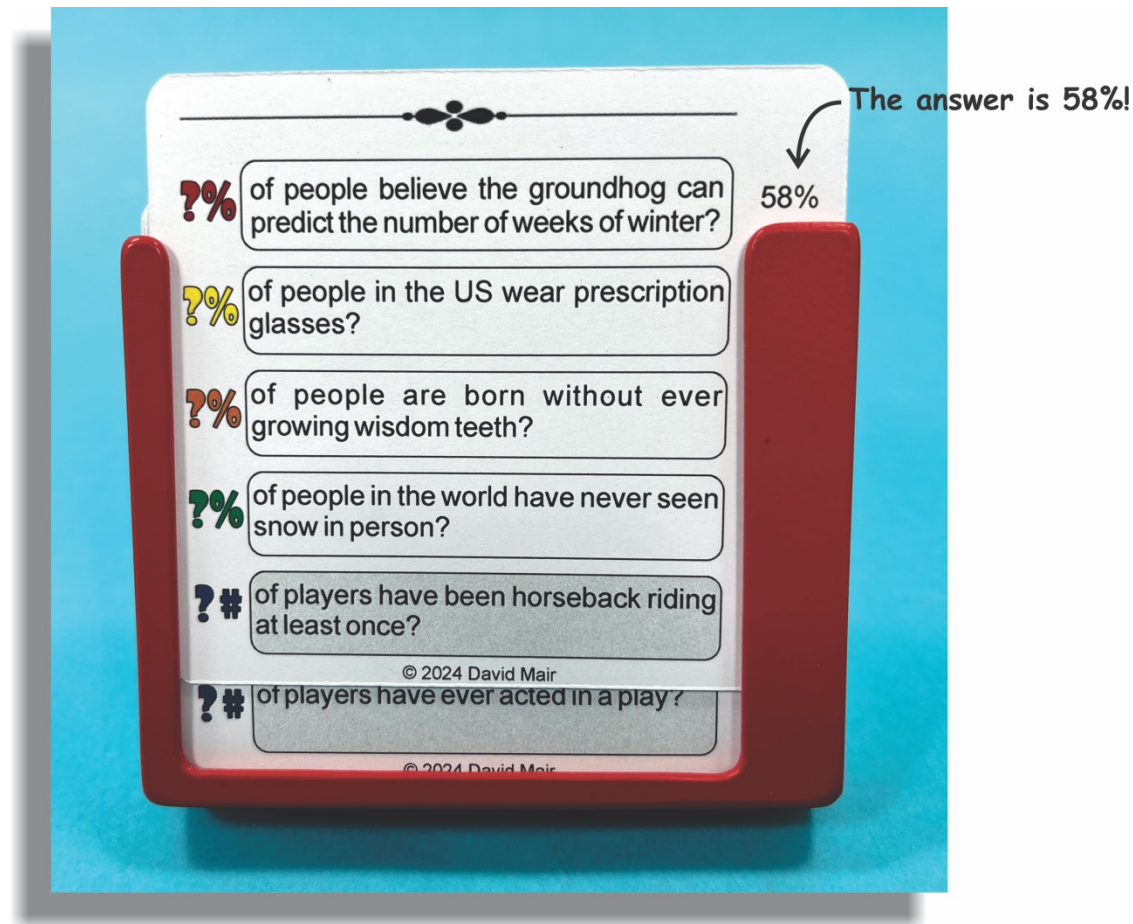
The starting player says what he believes is the correct answer to within 5% of the real answer.



The other players place their "Higher/Lower" disc on the table in front of them with either the "Higher" side up or the "Lower" side up.
What do you think?



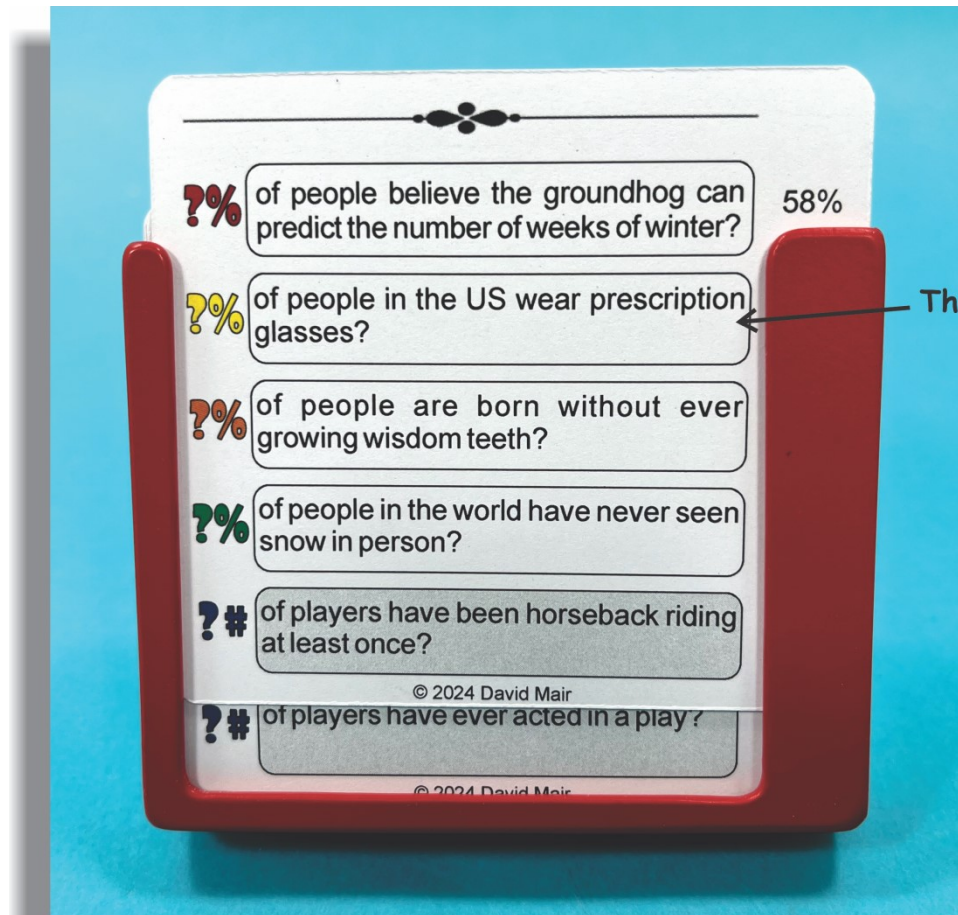
The answer is revealed by lifting up on the card just enough to see the answer. In this case, 58% of the people believe the groundhog can predict the number of weeks of winter.
How did you do?



Those players who said it would be lower get a scoring chip. The starting player gets 2 chips because the answer was within 5% of the real answer. The others do not score this round.

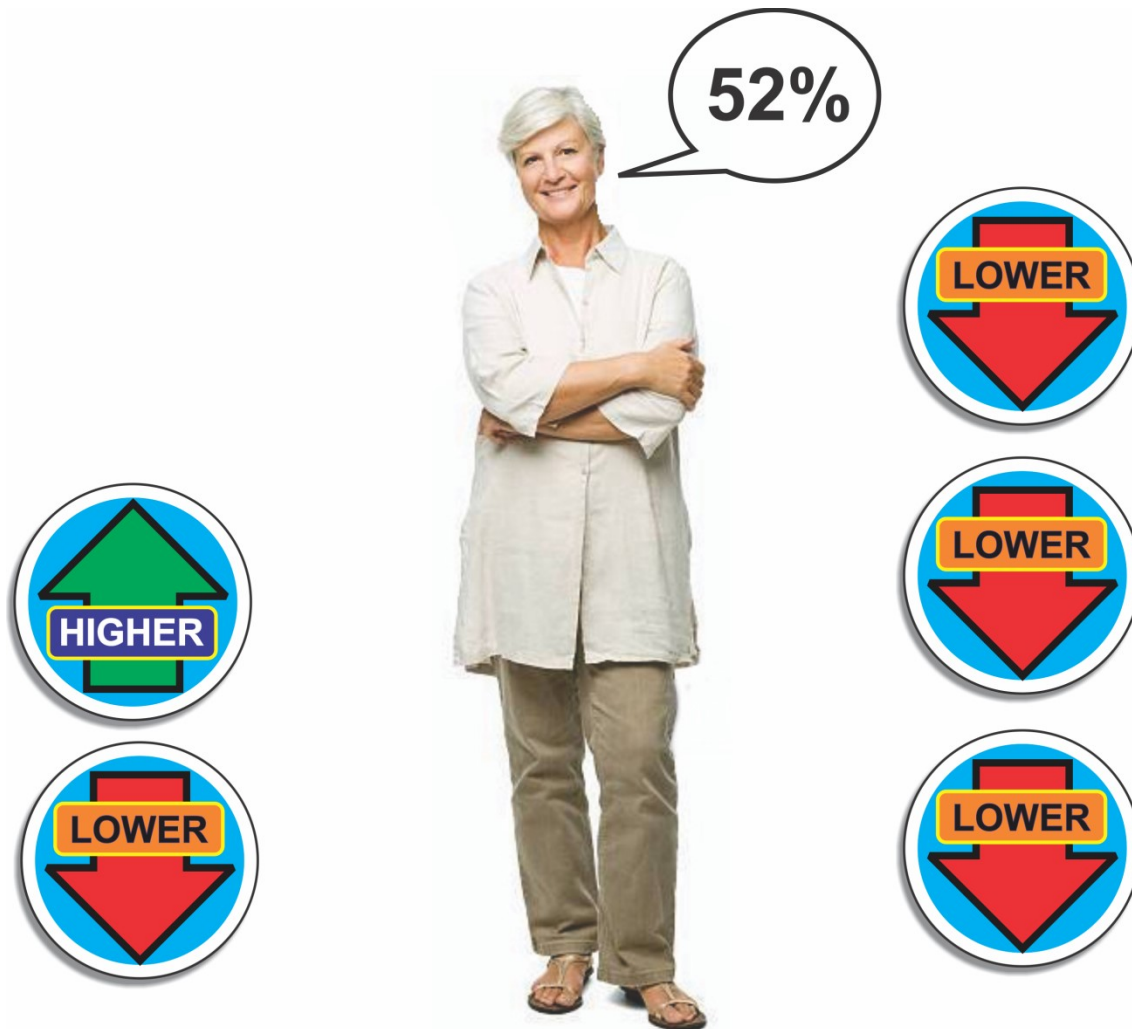


The player to the left of the starting player reads aloud and answers the next question; "What percent of people in the US wear prescription glasses?"

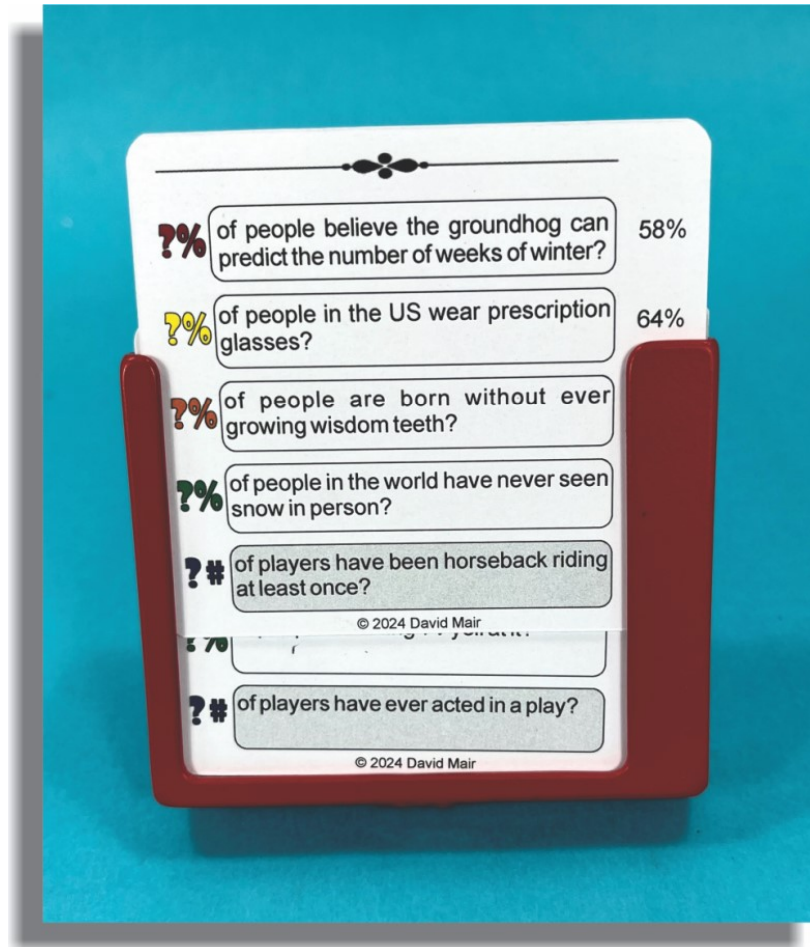


The next question.

The guessing player says "52%" as her guess. The other players place their "Higher/Lower discs down on the table. What do you think?



The card is pulled out just enough to reveal the answer, which is 64%.



The only player to collect a chip is player who bet it would be higher. The guesser was off by more than 5% so she doesn't score.



Here's a few more for you to try and guess the answer. Answers at the bottom of the slide.

?% of Americans said they've looked into their host's medicine cabinet.?

?% of men don't wash their hands after using a public toilet?

?% of women would rather go on a shopping spree than have sex?

?% of Americans dye their hair?

Answers from top to bottom.

25% 42% 57% 75%

The bottom question on the card is a "What Number" question about everyone playing the game. The guesser announces their guess, and the others bet in the usual way. Then everyone must answer the question truthfully. The correct answers are totaled and those who have guess correctly get a chip.

Here's a few sample questions from the game.

What Number...

?# of players have ever played "spin the bottle"?

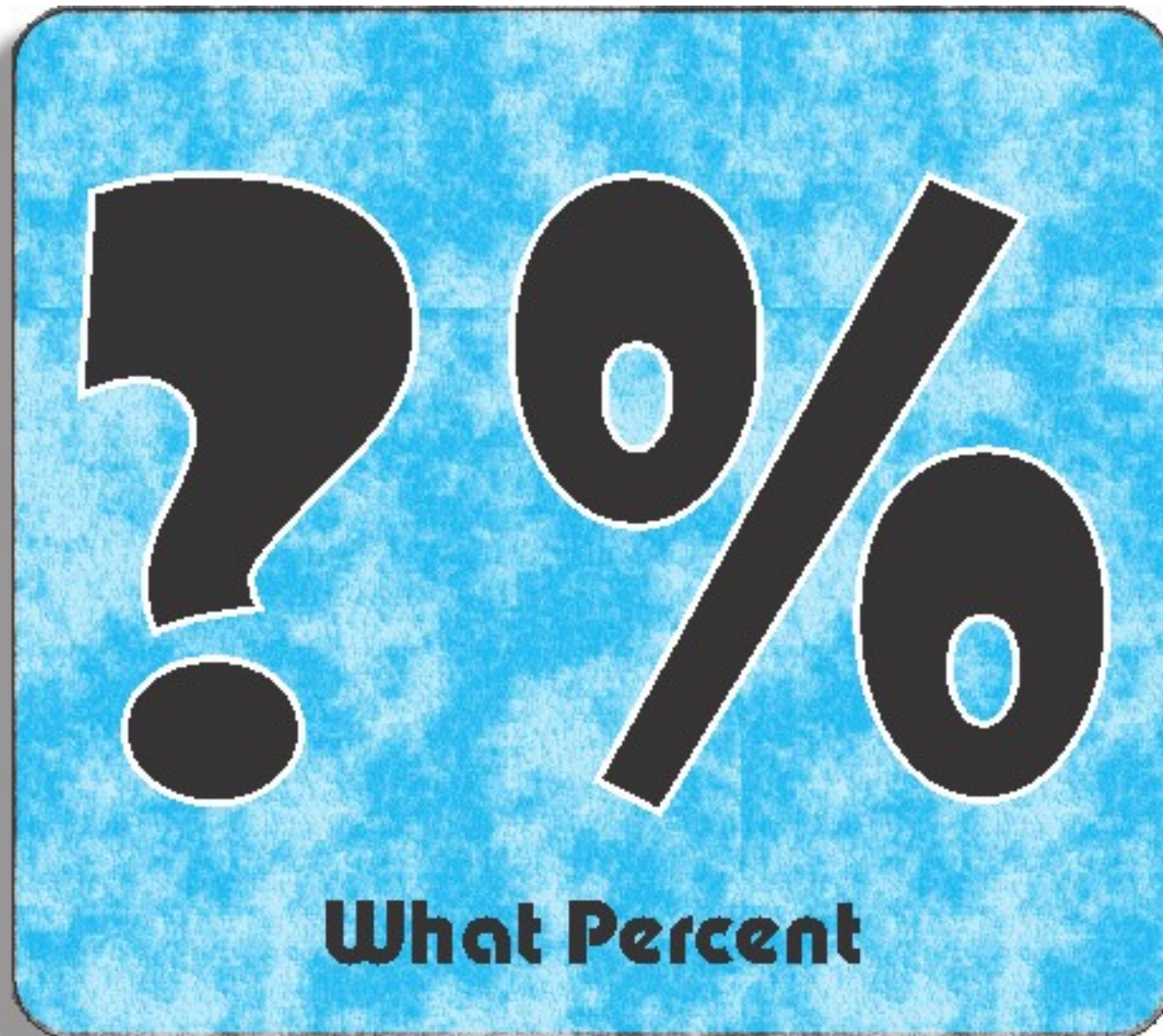
?# of players will know whether helenium is a flower or an element? [Google it]

?# of players have ever had to wear a cast?

?# of players have taken something from a store without paying for it?

The game continues with the role of guesser passing to the left as new cards are drawn. The game ends when all the chips have been passed out. The player with the most, wins the game
