

# You Decide

The game of two choices

**You Decide** is a game for up to 6 players, in which you have to decide between two choices on a given subject in four different categories.



**Patents**



**Law**



**Trivia**



**News**

To start the game, place the game board on the table. Each player chooses a playing piece and places it on the "Start" space. Shuffle and place the four piles of category cards on the table alongside the game board. The cards are placed face up so the pictures or written content is visible. This is so the answer on the back of each card cannot be seen.



Roll the die to determine which of the four categories everyone will be playing in the first round; in this case: "News". The top card of the "News" pile is selected and shown to all the players, who must decide if this is a real picture from the news or not.



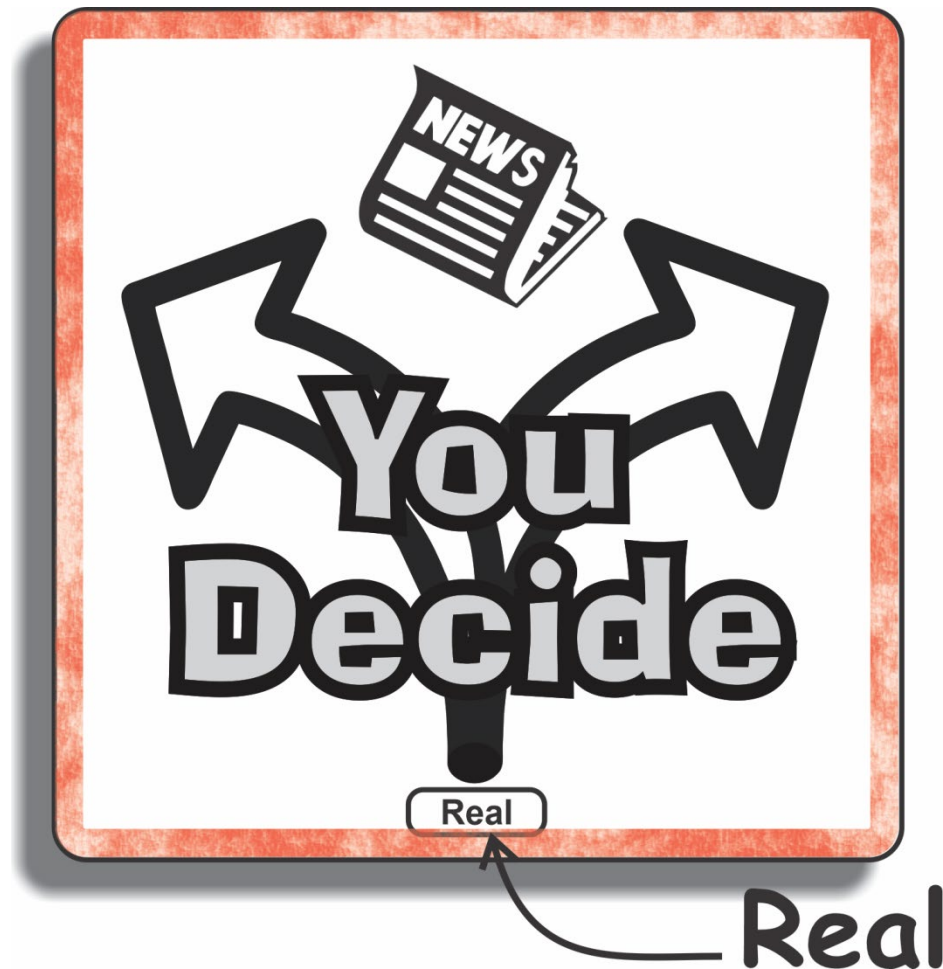

**Largest dog on record passes away**



You decide it's a real photo and say so. The other players also announce their decision, and the answer is revealed by turning the card over. REAL! You got it right and advance one space up the game board along with anyone else who guessed correctly.



The die is rolled to determine the next category. When a "wild" is rolled, the player rolling the die can choose any one of the four categories to play next. You choose Trivia and here's the question: "The moon is wider than Australia." Is that true or false? You decide.



**You Decide** ?

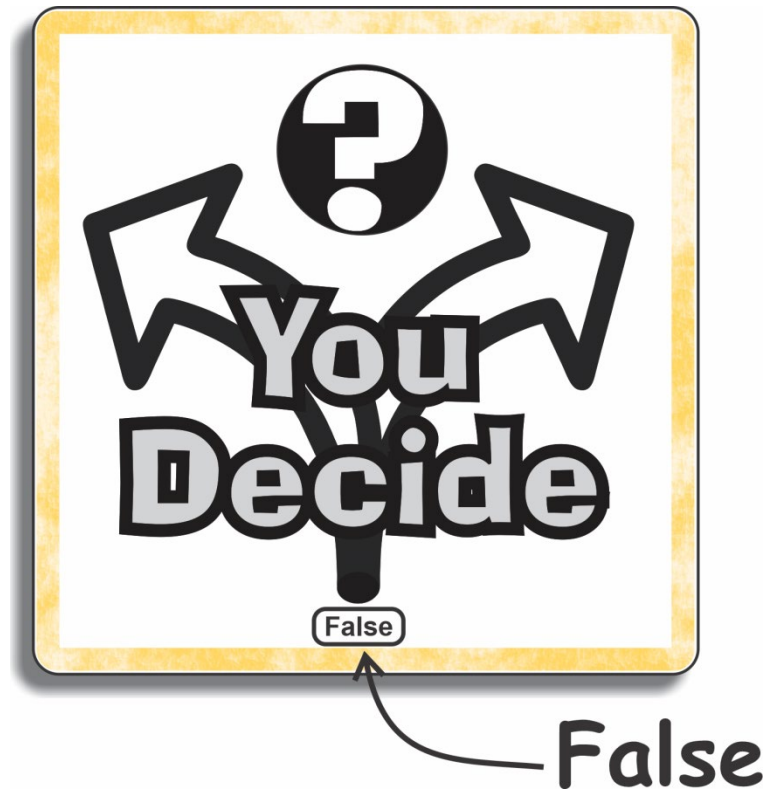

The moon is wider than Australia.

Look at the color of the square where your playing piece is sitting. You are on the same team as any of the other players who are on a matching colored square. All the members of a team must come to an agreement as to whether the statement is true or false. Those on a square with no matching colors have to answer on their own. All players on the same color square on each turn answer as a team throughout the game.



The answer is "false". Australia is 600km wider than the moon. If your team said "false" then all the members of the team advance one square. If a player said "true" they remain where they are.



Throughout the game, in addition to trivia, you will draw questions about real court cases that you have to decide whether the ruling went "for" or "against" the plaintiff, whether an invention that was patented is "real" or "fake", or whether pictures and stories in the news are "real" or "fake".

### Photocopied License Plates Lead Police to Printer

The Parkhurst police have arrested a local printer on charges of armed robbery. The police, after looking at the surveillance tape, were able to get the license plate of the get-away car, a Ford Escort. A DMV check revealed the plates belonged to a Buick Regal and were still on the car of the elderly owners. ### Tomato- Fruit or Vegetable

In 1893, in a case that went all the way to the Supreme Court, the Nix family, one of the largest produce sellers, sued the tax collector for the Port of New York to recover fees they had paid on tomatoes. The law, at the time, stated that a tax must be paid on imported vegetables but not fruit. The Nix family argued that any seed bearing structure formed from a flowering plant is a fruit, which tomatoes do. The Port of New York countered that everyone knew tomatoes as a vegetable and not a fruit regardless of seed location.

Did the US Supreme Court rule **FOR** or **AGAINST** the Nix family?

### User operated butt kicking machine

The user operated butt kicking machine uses 4 shoes attached to a rotating axle. The axle is attached to a crank that the user turns with their back to the rotating shoes. When cranked the shoes "kick" the operator in the butt as they rotate.

The game continues until one player reaches the "Finish" square. That player is the winner!
